1. How to build an Advisory Committee...

Choosing the right people....

- Industry Professionals What is the major industry player in your school sites area?
- College & University
 Representation
 Area Community Colleges & University
 Professors or Classified Staff
- Influential Community Members Community members with connections and buy in.

How often should I meet with the committee?

It is best to meet Quarterly, at least 4 times per year.

The purpose the committee serves is to get community support and in turn more opportunities for your students.

From Advisory Committee to Dual Enrollment

With the proper members of your committee in place begin the discussion of dual enrollment possibilities with the Community College.

If enrolled properly, students could earn up to 3 college units per semester!!

- Offer a parallel course utilizing the same text
